36% of eligible voting Americans that didn't vote said

White Paper #1: Views of Millennials On Abortion and the Brand of the Pro-Life Movement

KEY FINDINGS:

- Good news! In 2012, our poll showed that 44% of millennials were anti-abortion. In 2016, 53%. That's a 9 point increase in the pro-life direction!
- In our latest poll, we confirmed that millennials were majority "pro-life" (53%).
 However, only 36% will say they are. We have a "pro-life" brand problem.
- Did you know that only an extreme minority of millennials (17%) agree with Hillary Clinton on abortion?

White Paper #2: Views of Millennials On Planned Parenthood

KEY FINDINGS:

 In a September 2015 Quinnipiac poll, 66% of millennials said Planned Parenthood should continue to receive taxpayer funding, while 29% opposed it. In the our commissioned polling in February 2016, 47% of millennials said Planned Parenthood should receive taxpayer funding, while 36% opposed it. That is a 19-point drop in support for taxpayer funding of Planned Parenthood.
